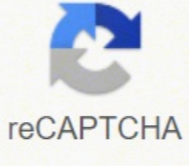

**Family Life** 

In ancient China, the family was the most important unit in society. The members of a family were expected to take care of each other and to be loyal to each other. The family members were also expected to honor their ancestors.

The grandparents, parents, and children lived together. The younger members of the family always had to show respect and obedience to their elders. Children thought of themselves first as members of their family, and secondly, as individuals. Chinese names were even written with the family name first and the individual name second.



Everyone in the family was responsible for the behavior of each family member. Any member of the family could bring honor or dishonor upon the entire family.

A son had to obey his father and even marry the bride his father picked for him. It was a son's duty to carry on the family name and manage the worship of the family's ancestors. A daughter could not do these duties because she became part of her husband's family when she married. A woman was expected to be obedient first to her father, then to her husband, and even to her adult sons if she was a widow.

In wealthy families, the men were responsible for the income of the family. The women spent most of their time at home managing household affairs. The women also raised silkworms to make silk. They wove cloth and made clothing. In poor families of farmers, shopkeepers, craftsmen, and other trades, the men, women, and children all worked together.

In wealthy families, boys learned reading and arithmetic, and the girls learned homemaking skills. In very wealthy families, boys also learned writing, history, and other subjects that would prepare them for official careers. In poor families, the boys and girls learned to do the kind of work their parents did. They had little or no schooling.

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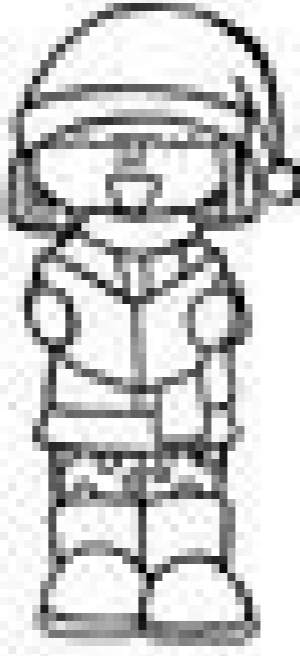
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# SINGING *Carols* AT CHRISTMAS

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Compare and Contrast: Memorial Day, Labor Day, and Veterans Day  
Compare and Contrast: Memorial Day, Labor Day, and Veterans Day  
Do your students know the difference between Veterans Day, Memorial Day, and Labor Day? In sum, students learn about their roles, rights, and responsibilities. Without historical knowledge, learning from the past is not possible. You can shop for books in stores, check them out from libraries and even buy them online, but you can also find free or inexpensive digital books for kids online. They also learn to process information and make decisions based on past experiences—even those they did not personally have. Because these programs are geared toward children learning the English language, they incorporate social studies and science lessons along with the reading skills.  
Nonprofit Literacy Groups  
Organizations like ReadWorks and edHelper have reading comprehension worksheets available on their websites. Social studies gives students the opportunity to explore and ask questions, connecting issues they read about in books and see in movies to a real-world context. It also has informative videos on topics like getting along with siblings or dealing with bullies. The home version offers a free eBook library for kids ages 3 to 11, including both fiction and nonfiction. Many of the books are free to read online. Courses in social studies show students how to reflect on societal concerns, appreciate global issues, read pertinent literature, and identify important community resources. The site even has a section on math.  
Oxford Owl  
Created by Oxford University Press, Oxford Owl offers a free site for parents and children to use at home, as well as a membership version for teachers and schools. You can also sort their books by collection or series. If you want to stick to the dozens of free books available, click on the one you like, and it will appear in a pop-up window. Some may require a membership sign-up, but for most of them, you can go straight to the link and start reading.  
Wilbooks  
Wilbooks offers free digital books for kids ages pre-K through third grade and reading levels A through M. Others are more collaborative and give teachers a place to share best practices and materials with others. Individual, school and classroom accounts are all available. Social studies is about more than learning about the past. Look for titles like Judy Moody, Diary of a Wimpy Kid, Smashie McPerter, Amelia, Stink and more. Although they're usually designed for use with the company's program, you can use them for other lessons. Book publishers sometimes produce worksheets to pair with their books. Why is it so important to understand the past? However, for a monthly fee or annual subscription, you can receive physical books in the mail and access educational printables. It's especially important for first graders because they're still learning language, and reading helps them understand the sounds and patterns words make. This reading comprehension worksheet will teach them about the similarities and differences of the holidays. Students Understand Sensitive Cultural Issues  
Students of all ages must develop an understanding of sensitive social issues, including the impact of sociocultural factors like class, race, and gender. Each book has its own activity guide, and you can buy the books from the site if you'd like to own a physical copy.  
International Children's Digital Library  
The International Children's Digital Library has one of the biggest selections of kids' books online. Students learn how to analyze and evaluate existing ideas and theories and determine how the future can be different. Beyond books, the Oxford Owl site offers a blog with advice for parents and kids on topics like summer reading and what to expect when school starts. If you sign up for a free account, you can create a virtual bookshelf with your child's favorites so that you can find them easily when you want. In addition to the worksheets, you get access to a community of educators who can help you find the right materials for your children.  
Literacy Programs  
Even for-profit literacy programs offer free worksheets for parents and teachers. Students Learn Political & Economic Skills  
In social studies courses, students learn about more than the basic history of the government and economic structure. One advantage of using these worksheets is that they are designed for specific reading levels and have been tested in a classroom. Many follow the formats used on state and local tests that measure reading ability. When children need extra practice using their reading skills, it helps to have worksheets available. Reading them is as easy as visiting one of these websites. If you're looking for materials to use in a homeschool setting or for after-school practice, check out these sites. Reading is important for kids of all ages, whether they're reading on their own or hearing stories from teachers, parents and the other adults in their lives. English learner sites are other good sources. If you're looking for additional practice while reading a specific book, check out their websites for graphic organizers and comprehension questions. You can also browse by series or Oxford Reading Level. This makes it easy to select worksheets that match the child's interest or to build background knowledge in specific areas.  
Teacher Resource Sites  
Whether you're a teacher or a parent, teacher resource websites are another option for finding reading worksheets. For example, there are books that are Common Core-approved, Spanish language books, joke books, alphabet books and more. You can narrow the selections down by age, length of book, topic and other categories. For very young students, this may involve learning how to recycle or pick up litter at the park. Students also have the opportunity to learn about the multicultural world we live in as well as the interdependence and relationship between cultures, countries, and people. For example, the company Reading Horizons has downloadable phonics worksheets that work with its digital phonics program and face-to-face lessons. Why is understanding the world on a social level so crucial? Students in elementary school through college explore a broad range of social studies topics in school to build understanding in humanities and social sciences. The teachers sometimes include anecdotal notes and tips for making the worksheets more effective.  
Publisher Websites  
Publishers of textbooks, education research and professional development books sometimes offer worksheets on their websites. For older students, this may involve learning how to read government documents or understanding why it is important to vote in local elections. There are math games and phonics guides, and you'll find a selection of activities to do at home, sorted by age and grade level.  
Storyline Online  
One of the most well-known sites where you'll find free online books for kids is Storyline Online. They learn how to examine different situations and contexts and then apply different ways of thinking to new situations. Many of these collections are themed by genre or subject matter. They understand the structure of the country's government and also learn how resources are allocated. On the ReadWorks website, you can search for worksheets by grade level, text type and topic. It is important to examine history and improve upon it over time. A common school of thought is that failure to understand the past means that society is doomed to repeat mistakes. Students Respect History  
Social studies is also essential for helping students understand history and its influence on the modern world. Some sites like Teachers Pay Teachers let teachers upload worksheets they've created and offer them for sale. These worksheets usually are samples from the books they publish so that you can preview the content. Choose from more than 4,000 titles in approximately 60 languages. Teacher Websites  
There are several teacher websites where you can download reading comprehension worksheets they created for their classrooms. The FunBrain site also has games for kids of ages and videos like Kidz Bop, Teen Titans Go! and Highlights Kids. They learn to appreciate justice, equality, and building responsible relationships in society. Social studies fills in the gaps that other types of coursework may not necessarily cover. Once it does, you can start reading.
